#### Miscellaneous

Although his practice time is limited, Fr. Maillet still plays solo piano recitals on occasion. At. St. Patrick's Seminary (2010–2017) he gave annual recitals often featuring works of a single composer such as Beethoven, Chopin, or Rachmaninov. He also taught music appreciation informally to fellow faculty members, who dubbed these sessions "Mozart with Maillet." His most recent musical activities in the United States have included lectures, master classes, and concerts in Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Connecticut. In the summer of 2024, he played a solo recital at a classical music festival, Aigues-Vives-en-Musiques, in the south of France near Montpelier.

Fr. Maillet has given mini-retreats and evenings of recollection on topics such as "St. Thomas Aquinas and the Virtues" and "Reading Scripture with St. Therese."

He has written articles such as "St. Paul and Prayer" in *Priest Magazine* in 2008 and "Researching the Ban" in the autumn 2018 issue of *Nouvelles de Jerusalem*. In 2022, he coauthored (along with Drs. Michael Gorman and Rebecca Hancock) "Teaching Scripture in a Catholic Seminary" for *Seminary Journal*.
