
4-Day Onsite Seminar and 8 Zoom Follow-Ups Forming Supervisors for Vocational Synthesis:

A Program for Pastor-Supervisors and their Collaborators

Description

The *Program of Priestly Formation* (6th edition) offers a new vision of the final stage of preparation for the priesthood: the Vocational

Synthesis stage. During this stage, the primary formator of the newly ordained cleric is the pastor of the parish where the deacon is assigned. The pastor-supervisor and his collaborators need the *training*, *resources*, and *ongoing consultation and support* to embrace their responsibilities, further develop their skills, and expand their understanding of accompanying, supervising, evaluating, and assisting the



deacon to achieve his formational goals and the benchmarks of the Vocational Synthesis Stage.

PRONUNCIATION for PASTORS

OFFERED ONSITE OR ONLINE SCHEDULED AS NEEDED

Three 4-6 Session Courses (Synchronous and Asynchronous)

Pronunciation for Pastors: A Program for International Priests

- Three levels, placement determined by pre-assessment diagnostic.
- Individualized instruction with lessons and feedback.
- In-person or Online.

Description

Each course will be six weeks long, including both asynchronous and synchronous elements. Participants should expect to spend 4-6 hours a week, (includes lessons, feedback, and 30-60 minutes of real-time, individualized instruction). Individualized instruction occurs either in-person or via Zoom, depending on students' schedules and preferences. At enrollment, participants use a diagnostic to determine which level would be most appropriate.

Levels/Courses

LEVEL 1: The Basics—Six detailed lessons, with video and interactive software, to cover the following topics: Individual Sounds, Syllables and Word Endings, Word Stress, Sentence Stress, and Thought Groups, Linking and Blending, Focus and Intonation.

LEVEL 2: The Lectionary and Common Prayers— Proclamation skills, emphasizing thought groups, intonation, and focus words. Practice proclaiming various genres in the lectionary as well as common prayers, including the Eucharistic Prayers.

LEVEL 3: Homilies and Dialogue—Focus on North American conventions for homilies and review pronunciation strategies clear for preaching and effective dialogue. Proceeding from the liturgical calendar, students will analyze homilies as well as receive feedback on their pronunciation for their own homilies.
