	of Amos, Hosea, Micah and Isaiah will be examined closely in light of the
	historical context out of which they arose and the major theological themes
	encountered in them, including creation, covenant, faithfulness, and justice.
	Students will engage current issues in contemporary scholarship on the 8 th
	century prophets, and explore the theological and ethical implications of their
	message for both ancient and contemporary communities of faith.
