**Conference Venue
and Guest Facility**



The Center for Continuing Formation at St. Mary's Seminary & University in Baltimore is a 30,000 square-foot facility with a variety of conference spaces, small meeting rooms and private hotel quality guest rooms and suites.

The Center also has an oratory, a private chapel and its own dining room.

The Center adjoins the main seminary building and yet provides great privacy for its guests.



Conference Venues

The Forum

The Forum features graded seating with movable ergonomic chairs to accommodate 58 participants. The fixed tables are in a semicircular pattern on three levels and include electrical receptacles and data ports. Movable tables at the lowest level allow for a variety of configurations. Large windows with semi-opaque shades, a large three-paneled whiteboard, ceiling mounted microphones, an LCD projector and a dedicated recorder make this an ideal venue for presentations and for capturing events on DVD and other digital formats.

The Seminar Room

The Seminar Room contains movable tables and chairs to accommodate 25 participants. The versatile space adapts well for small group work.

The Conference Room

The Conference Room features movable cherrywood tables and ergonomic chairs for 30 participants. This contemporary boardroom atmosphere is appointed with drapes and credenzas, a sound system and a tastefully mounted white board with retractable screens. The room is Wi-Fi enabled and an LCD projector is available.

The Chart Room

Smaller meeting rooms include The Chart Room which is Wi-Fi enabled and has boardroom style seating for 6 to 12, as well as three smaller parlors which provide a relaxed atmosphere with couches and chairs to seat 6 to 12 people.





Dining

The Forum Café

The Forum Café offers casual dining for up to 60 guests. Serving a variety of entrees at its hot buffet and salad bar, the Café is arranged with individual tables seating two to six guests. Festive dining with table service, tablecloths, cloth napkins, candles and other amenities can be arranged.

In addition, both the Sun Room and the Center Terrace can be set up for cocktail receptions and for buffet luncheon and dinner service to accommodate 5 to 20 seated guests.



Prayer Space



The Oratory

The Oratory is a small meditation chapel with the reserved Sacrament. This reflective atmosphere is ideal for private prayer or may accommodate up to 8 for a liturgy.



St. Charles Chapel

The St. Charles Chapel is a private ecumenical chapel suitable for liturgies and prayer services with seating for 40, equipped with an ambo, altar and piano.



Accommodations

Thirty Guest Rooms, accessible by either an elevator or stairwell, are available with:

- A queen-sized bed
- Private bathroom
- An easy chair with ottoman
- A study area including a desk and an adjustable ergonomic chair
- Individual climate controls
- Telephone with voice mail
- Wi-Fi
- Outside view of the courtyard or woodlands

There are nine specialized rooms.

- Three Parlor Suites include an additional sitting area furnished with a love seat, armchair and television.
- Three Living Room Suites include a separate sitting room furnished with a queen-sized convertible couch, an armchair and a television enclosed with an armoire.
- Three Special Needs Suites are outfitted for those with limited mobility and are designed to accommodate wheelchairs.

RATES

Although designed primarily for the continuing formation of priests and deacons, The Center has hosted an array of organizations and guests.
